Arts Council Collection Launches New Series of Contemporary Art Exhibitions at Longside Gallery, Yorkshire Sculpture Park

Catch This is a series of exhibitions which showcases some of the very latest acquisitions to the Arts Council Collection and give a tantalising insight into the work of some of Britain's hottest contemporary art talent. Catch This 2008 features work by four artists who are all rapidly establishing international reputations: Karla Black, Hilary Lloyd, Lucy Skaer and Tania Kovats. The series will be shown exclusively at Longside Gallery in Yorkshire Sculpture Park from 24 May to 2 November 2008.

Glasgow-based artist **Karla Black** opens the **Catch This** series with a site-specific presentation of her delicate sculptural work *Unused To* (2007). This will be the first time the work has been seen in the UK. Black has received significant acclaim for her distinctive sculptures made from everyday and often perishable materials. Her work has recently been shown at Tate Britain, and in Cologne, Luxemburg, Milan and New York. *Unused To* (2007) is an evocative two-part sculpture made from familiar domestic materials such as sugar paper, chalk, ribbon, polythene, vitamin E body cream, nail vanish, hair gel and toothpaste. Karla Black will be installing the work herself in the project space which will be open to the public daily from 24 May to 29 June 2008.

Catch This: Karla Black is followed by displays of other recent additions to the Arts Council Collection including a mesmerising film installation by Hilary Lloyd, an intriguing range of drawing, sculpture and film work by Lucy Skaer, and a selection of Tania Kovats' drawings and found objects which explore the cultural and historical symbolism of the white horse.

For over sixty years, the Arts Council Collection has supported emerging artists in this country through the purchase and display of their work. To complement the **Catch This** series the Arts Council Collection will be holding 'Collecting the New' – a Study Day in September which will provide a chance to find out more about the diversity and range of contemporary British art and how it is acquired for the nation.
